## **Preface**

It was a great honor for the University of Jordan to organize the 11<sup>th</sup> Eurasia Conference on Chemical Sciences (EuAsC<sub>2</sub>S-11), which was held at the Dead Sea, Jordan from 6 to 10 October 2010.
